TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT LUZERNE COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND KEYSTONE COLLEGE

Luzerne County Community College and Keystone College have agreed to a correlation of their curricula for students in the attached degree programs who wish to complete the baccalaureate degree at Keystone College. Subject to the terms of this agreement, a student who satisfactorily completes the requirements of the Associate degree at Luzerne will be granted 'junior' status and may complete the Keystone requirements for the bachelor's degree within four regular semesters as a full-time student.

The following terms shall apply to all students:

- 1. The student must achieve a minimum grade point average of 2.00.
- 2. The student must meet deadline dates for application, payment of fees, etc., that would normally apply to other new students at Keystone.
- 3. The student shall choose the recommended elective courses and course sequences as agreed to on the attached course equivalence sheet.
- 4. A maximum of 75 transfer credits may be applied towards the bachelor's degree at Keystone College.
- 5. A grade of "C" or better is required for course transfer.
- 6. If any of the above terms and conditions is not met, Keystone College shall determine appropriate transfer of credit on an individual basis.
- 7. Students who wish to transfer to Keystone College prior to qualifying for the Associate degree at Luzerne County Community College must submit their transcript for evaluation on a course-by-course basis by Keystone College.

Conditions of the Agreement:

- 1. The directors of the respective programs/departments at both Institutions will monitor compliance with the terms of this Agreement.
- 2. The term of this Agreement shall be five (5) years commencing when all applicable signatures are obtained.
- 3. This Agreement may be terminated, at any time, by either Institution by written notice thirty (30) days in advance of the effective date of termination. It is understood that any termination will not apply to students who have already begun one of the attached Associate degree programs at Luzerne County Community College or the bachelor's degree program at Keystone College. In the event of a substantial breach, such as, a lack of response to requests for information and a lack of adequate participation, either party may immediately terminate this Agreement.
- 4. The relationship of the parties to this Agreement shall not be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture, or any other relationship, other than that of independent contractors.

- 5. Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities as a result of this Agreement. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this contract. Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver of any immunities afforded LCCC by law or otherwise.
- 6. This Agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties. This Agreement can be modified only in writing with the same formality as the original agreement.
